Synopsis: The sheriff of the county where the action is filed is responsible for the service of process by certified mail. Attorney General Opinion No. 92-83 is accordingly revised. Cited herein: L. 1992, ch. 290.

Dear Mr. Hirsch:


On June 30, 1992 we opined in Attorney General Opinion No. 92-83 that the sheriff of the county where the documents are to be served shall be responsible for the service of process by certified mail.

Shortly thereafter the 1992 Session laws were distributed. In chapter 290, section 1, the legislature addressed the matter and determined that "the sheriff of the county wherein the action is filed shall serve any process by certified mail." L. 1992, ch. 290, § 1.

Therefore, Attorney General Opinion No. 92-83 is accordingly revised.
