Dear Mr. Blanchard:

In regard to Attorney General Opinion No. 76-361, it appears that I neglected to consider the ramifications of Senate Bill 1021, Chapter 39 of the 1976 Session Laws upon the question of whether architects and engineers may practice land surveying without being licensed by this state to practice such.

Section 2 of Senate Bill 1021 provides:

"It shall be unlawful for any person to practice or offer to practice land surveying, as defined in the provisions of this act, or to use in connection with his or her name, or otherwise assume, or advertise any title or description intended to convey the impression that he or she is a land surveyor, unless such person has been duly registered or exempted under the provisions of this act, or the act which is supplementary hereto, or is a licensed professional engineer or architect in the state of Kansas."

Thus, architects and engineers may practice land surveying without being licensed or registered as land surveyors.
